Agenda Item I: Welcome and Call to Order

IUPUI Faculty Council Vice President Jeff Watt called the meeting to order.

Agenda Item II: Adoption of the Agenda as the Order of Business for the Day

Agenda Item III: Approval of the Minutes of the November 7, 2017, Meeting

The minutes of the November 7, 2017, meeting were approved and entered into the record.

Agenda Item IV: Updates/Remarks from the Chancellor

Nasser Paydar, Indiana University Executive Vice President and Chancellor of IUPUI

Paydar reported on the following:

- Board of Trustees Meeting: The Multidisciplinary Research and Classroom Building was approved for construction for IUPUI. The 100,000 square-foot facility be another home for the Schools of Science and Engineering and Technology. The School of Informatics and Computing will also have classroom space available. The building will be located on the southeast corner of Blackford and Michigan Streets. Groundbreaking is expected in fall 2018 and ready for occupation in fall 2020. The restructuring of the Schools of Physical Education and Tourism Management and Health and Rehabilitation Sciences was also approved. The new name will be the School of Health and Human Sciences.
- School of Education: The founding dean search has begun, and we hope to have an announcement by July 1.

- Paydar expressed deep concern of the national tax bill that was passed by the federal legislature and said we need to raise our voice when our students and employees are affected. Portions of the bill will affect each in a negative way. The budget has to go through committee now. The Senate bill is friendlier than the House bill. Each branch has to come up with one bill that is presented back to legislature. It is hoped that there are improvements in the final bill.
- For All Campaign Update: The goal is \$1.1 billion. At the end of November, \$2.1 million had been raised (with IUPUI leading).

Agenda Item V: Updates/Remarks from the IFC President

Rachel Applegate, IUPUI Faculty President

Applegate reported on the following:

- Reorganization of the Schools of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences and Physical Education and Tourism Management: She reviewed the process outlined in the University Faculty Council policy on mergers and reorganizations. Part of the processes were not followed in the discussion of the merger of the school. Would the merger cause any hardships on the rest of the campus? Because there were very few objections from either school for the merger and it would cause no hardship on the campus, the Faculty Council Executive Committee approved the proposal without coming to the IFC.
- University Faculty Council: Language for sexual harassment cases where faculty are involved was modified when it comes to filing a Faculty Board of Review in University Policies UA-03 “Sexual Misconduct” and ACA-17 “Faculty Boards of Review: Minimum Standards for Uniform Hearing Procedures.” A new vice president for International affairs was named (Hannah Buxbaum). The UFC is looking at career paths for non-tenure-track faculty.
- The IFC will add a section to the Office of Academic Affairs newsletter to inform all faculty members of council actions.
- A survey will go to the faculty in January for interest in service on the Board of Review Pool, the Faculty Grievance Advisory Panel, the Nominating Committee, and the Athletics Affairs Committee. Another survey will be sent in March for IFC committee service. Administrative committees will be added to the committee survey to add wider participation. She encouraged participation on both surveys.

Agenda Item VII: [Action Item—Vote] Determination of “N” for 2017-2019

Rachel Applegate

Circular 2017-17: Chart Showing Determination of “N” (appended)

Applegate presented the chart showing “N.” After discussion, a motion was made and seconded that the IFC approve “N” to be 50/51 which would allow for 36 unit representatives for the next two years. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item VIII: Call for IFC or UFC Standing Committee Reports

- Academic Affairs Committee (Mark Bannatyne, Chair): Bannatyne discussed moving the date for the IUPUI Commencement and made the following motion: The Academic Affairs Committee moves to set the date of the IUPUI Commencement Ceremony for the Saturday before Mother’s Day each year and that the Academic Calendar reflect this change. Date adjustments should be

made to the Saturday after Mother's Day for 2020, 2021, and 2022 based on the availability of the venue. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

- Campus Planning Committee (Kristi Palmer, Chair): Palmer said the committee meets once per month and had focused on the questions for the Campus Conversations. Those questions centered on campus communication, strategic priorities (space and current methods for online education were identified), financial planning (RCM review and 3% cash reserves – what would we do if the percentage were higher), and organizational change (medical school reporting). The committee will discuss the findings received. The Climate of Higher Education environmental scan developed by Dr. David Malik was reviewed. In a future meeting, they will hear a report from Anne Mitchell and Robbie Janik about student facing surveys. The committee will provide feedback. They will also provide feedback on the IUPUI Strategic Plan.
- Ad Hoc Committee on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (Jack Windsor, Chair): Windsor said the committee drafted the following charge for a new standing committee as follows:

Title: IFC Committee on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (IFC DEI)

Introduction

Striving for an equitable and inclusive campus enables the IUPUI community to study, understand and celebrate multiple ways of knowing and being. Our goal is to produce graduates prepared to navigate an increasingly complex and diverse world while attracting, developing, and retaining faculty and staff who are more engaged on campus and in their communities.

Charge: This committee is to advise and make recommendations to the IFC and campus leadership on issues relative to promoting and ensuring diversity, equity and inclusion.

To accomplish this charge, the committee shall have, but will not be limited to, the following duties:

- Promote the recruitment, hiring, retention and advancement of diverse faculty and staff
- Advocate for increased recruitment, enrollment, retention and graduation of students from diverse backgrounds and experiences
- Disseminate information and successful practices related to diversity, equity and inclusion in higher education
- Ensure the availability of mentoring opportunities for diverse faculty
- Review and make recommendations based on campus DEI plans and reports
- Provide guidance to academic and support units with their DEI plans upon request
- Provide a representative/liaison to meetings of the Chancellor's Diversity Cabinet and the Vice Chancellor's Diversity Group
- Encourage campus development of DEI education and training opportunities for faculty, staff and students

Composition: Voting members of this committee shall be comprised of one faculty representative from each academic unit, one staff representative, and two student representatives (one undergraduate and one graduate). The ex officio members shall include the associate vice chancellor for faculty diversity and inclusion and the vice chancellor for diversity, equity and inclusion.

The ad hoc committee discussed how people think of what diversity, equity, and inclusion is. Conversations were held with Dr. Karen Dace and an IUB representation on diversity. This is a first read as it is a constitutional change; a vote will be taken in January.

- Nominations Committee (Marianne Wokeck, Chair): Wokeck announced that Prof. Lindsey Mayo was elected as a member of the Nominating Committee. His term is through June 2019. Prof. Olguta Buse will serve as co-chair of the committee this year and as chair in 2018-19.
- Research Affairs Committee (Vicky Champion, Chair): Champion gave a report (slides appended).

 - Administrative review committee process such that if financial interest is less than \$25,000 and doesn't involve faculty start-up, handled through an Administrative review committee

Changes in Common Rule

- New definition of clinical trial-expands scope-one or more human subjects prospectively assigned to interventions to evaluate XXX-not only drug and device but behavioral
- People in compliance office designate as exempt
- Annual Once exempt-doesn't have to come back for review-anything after January 2018
